INJURY AND ILLNESS POLICY

There may be instances when your child will not be able to participate due to an injury or illness. In order to be excused your child must bring a note excusing them from participation. All notes must be taken to the school nurse before school.

- > A Parent Note will excuse a student from physical education for a maximum of three (3) days. The student is still expected to dress out, when excused by a parent note. No more than two parental excuses a semester will be accepted.
- > A Doctor's Note will excuse a student from participation and from dressing out.

PERSONAL PROPERTY

Each student is issued a locker and a combination lock in order to secure his/her belongings while participating in physical education. Students are not to share lockers or combinations with others. All locks are to be locked during P.E. class. Students are held responsible for all items in their locker. It is recommended that students bring a zip lock bag or small box to protect jewelry. Students should notify a teacher immediately if a lock is missing. If the lock is not recovered a student may purchase a replacement lock for \$7.00 (Please make checks payable to the Francis Howell School District). It is recommended that students do not bring large sums of money to school. Lost or stolen items should be reported immediately.

CLASS CONDUCT

Students are expected to follow the same behavioral expectations in Physical Education as they do through out the school day. However, students **may NOT chew gum** in physical education class. Students are expected to be dressed out and in their squads five minutes after the bell has rung. No glass is to be brought into the locker room and no aerosols such as Axe deodorant spray.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION CLOTHING

The dress code established by the Francis Howell School District Physical Education Department is designed to provide a healthy and safe environment. It is suggested that your child purchase a uniform to maintain compliance. Uniforms may be purchased through your child's teacher. At a cost of \$5.00 for a shirt and \$6.00 for shorts (Please make checks payable to the Francis Howell School District). Jackets and or warm-ups may be worn when weather conditions warrant them. Other requirements include:

- > Athletic tennis shoes (must be laced and tied, no heels, or hiking boots)
- ➤ Cotton athletic socks
- > Shirts will be marked at school with a permanent marker indicating students name (Instructors will do this)
- > Shirts may not be tied.
- > Shorts may not be rolled.
- > No jewelry may be worn during participation
 - New piercing may be worn for a period of eight (8) weeks, but they must be covered with tape furnished by the student.
 - In order to wear a piercing the student should submit a note from their parent to their teacher requesting this.
 - Failure to follow these guidelines will result in an inability to participate and a loss of participation points.
 - Students wishing to wear a tongue ring must submit a note to the nurse.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION GRADES

Grades will be determined by:

- dressing out (students not dressed out will have an alternate activity)
- written work
- participation
- class conduct
- sportsmanship

Students will lose points for the following violations:

• First No Dress -10 points

• Second No Dress -20 (a note is sent home informing parents)

• Third No Dress -30 (A detention is issued)

• Poor Participation -10

• Inappropriate Dress, gum or jewelry -5

• Uncooperative or unsportsman like conduct -5

PHYSICAL EDUCATION CLASSES

During the first and fourth quarters students will participate in physical education daily. During the second and third quarters students will alternate every 4 weeks between health and physical education. During the Health portion of instruction students will be assigned a book. The approximate cost of the books is \$40.00 each. Students failing to respect classroom materials will be fined accordingly.
